

<u>Wolf Food</u>: Read the wolf story from the talk "Agency and Accountability" by Elder Shayne M. Bowen. Cut these "wolf food" pieces apart and take turns choosing them out of a pile one at a time. Read them to decide if it's something that would feed the "evil" wolf or the "good" wolf. Put it in the paper bag for the wolf it's feeding. Encourage them to think about which wolf inside of themselves they're "feeding" with the choices they make each day.



Good Wolf Bag: Glue the wolf head either onto a paper bag or attach the mouth to a Ziploc bag. Cut hole where the mouth is. Attach snout above mouth hole. Have kids pull the snout up to feed the wolf the "good" wolf food pieces.
